Commissioner Moyle: Thanked Liam Love for his interest in local government. Has done the science on masks - has a friend with a molecular degree. Masks have been politicized, the science is not there to support masks. He has also had his nose broken 5 or 6 times - making it hard to breathe thru a mask.

Commissioner Barron: Concurs with Commissioner Moyle. Mask mandates are a violation of constitutional rights, and have been politicized. It is a control mechanism. Thank you for your question. UPCAP - concerned with leadership in Michigan and D.C regarding the Great Lakes Tunnel. He is on the Judicial Committee for the Michigan Association of Counties.
