- 1. Solar Presentation.
- M. Charles Gould, MSU Extension Bioenergy Educator, gave a presentation on dual use practices for solar energy systems followed by a question and answer session.

Warren Bovin, Escanaba Township - addressed the Board with his concerns regarding property values near solar farms and the potential for installing solar farms on government properties instead of agricultural land.

Paul Putnam, MSU District 1 Director - addressed the Board on how to move forward together with the solar farm issue.

Barbie Clairmont, Escanaba Township - addressed the Board regarding her concerns with ground water contamination due to solar farms, as well as her concerns about the annexation issue.

Bonnie Hakkola, Escanaba - addressed the Board on the need for reliable sources of energy from all sources, including nuclear, and the need to focus on this issue long term.

Chris Williams, Ford River Township - seconded Ms. Hakkola's suggestion of nuclear power and asked why covering
